

Non-oil and oil exports increase by $\xi 7,F$ % and $1 \cdot 9,1$ % in April $\Gamma \cdot \Gamma 1$

Overall merchandise exports increased by ΛV_{*} , χ in April $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{1}$ compared to April $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{1}$. The value of exports amounted to $VI_{*}\Gamma_{*}$ billion riyals in April $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{1}$, up from $\Gamma_{*}\Lambda_{*}I$ billion riyals in April $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{1}$. This increase originated mainly from oil exports, which rose by ΓV_{*} . billion riyals or $\Gamma_{*}\Lambda_{*}I$ in the same period. The share of oil exports in total exports, therefore, increased from $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{*}I$ (April $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{*}I$) to $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{*}I$. Compared to the previous month (March $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{1}I$), total merchandise exports decreased by $\Gamma_{*}\Gamma_{*}I$ billion riyals or $\Gamma_{*}I$.

Non-oil exports increased by $\xi 1, 7\%$ in April $\Gamma.\Gamma 1$, rising up to 19, 7 billion riyals from $1\%, \xi$ billion riyals in April $\Gamma.\Gamma.$ Of the most important non-oil goods, 'Plastics and Rubber and Articles Thereof' (representing 7%, 0% of non-oil merchandise exports) increased by $\xi 1, 9\%$, 1, 9 billion riyals and 'Products of the Chemical or Allied Industries' (%., 0% of non-oil merchandise exports) increased by $0\xi, 7\%$, $\Gamma, 1$ billion riyals from April $\Gamma.\Gamma.$ Non-oil exports decreased compared to the previous month (March $\Gamma.\Gamma 1$) by $\Gamma, 7$ billion riyals or ($\Gamma, 7\%$).

Merchandise imports increased by IV, $\xi \chi$ (V, $\xi \chi$ billion riyals) year-on-year in April Γ . Γ I. The value of imports amounted to $\xi \eta$,I billion riyals in April Γ . Γ I compared to ξI , Λ billion riyals in April Γ . Γ I. This increase was due to the increase in many sectors compared to April Γ . Γ I., mainly 'Pearls; Precious Stones; Imitation Jewellery' (IV $\Gamma \xi \chi$) and 'Machinery and Mechanical Appliances; Electrical Equipment' ($\Gamma \xi \chi$). Imports, decreased compared to the previous month (March Γ . Γ I), by -I, Γ I billion riyals or Γ I.

Ratio of Non-oil Exports to Imports increased to $\xi \cdot \cdot \cdot \%$

The ratio of non-oil exports to imports increased to ξ_{-1} , χ in April Γ_{-1} from Γ_{-1} in April Γ_{-1} , as a result of a higher increase in non-oil exports (ξ_{-1} , ξ_{-1}) than in imports (ξ_{-1}) over that period.

China is Saudi Arabia's main trading partner for merchandise trade

In April Γ . Γ I, exports to China amounted to I Γ ,9 billion riyals, making this country the main destination for exports of Saudi Arabia. India and Japan followed next with Λ , billion riyals and Γ , Γ billion riyals, respectively. South Korea, U.S.A, United Arab Emirates, Egypt, Italy, the Netherlands, and Belgium were the other countries that ranked in the top I. destinations. Exports of Saudi Arabia to those I. countries amounted to Γ 0,0 billion riyals, accounting for Γ 1.9% of the total exports.

Imports from China amounted to 9, Γ billion riyals in April Γ . Γ 1, making this country the main origin for imports of Saudi Arabia. United Arab Emirates and U.S.A followed next with imports of Σ 1, billion riyals and Γ 3, billion riyals, respectively. India, Japan, Germany, Canada, Italy, the Netherlands and France were the other countries that ranked in the top 1. countries for imports. Imports of Saudi Arabia from those 1. countries amounted to Γ 1, billion riyals, accounting for Γ 1. Γ 2 of the total imports.

Top Five Customs Ports for Imports

IT,7 billion riyals of imports, corresponding to Γ_0 , V_2 of the total, entered the Kingdom from Jeddah Islamic Sea Port in April Γ . Γ I. Among the other major ports of entry for the imports were King Abdulaziz Port (19, ξ_2), King Khalid International Airport (1 ξ_1 , ξ_2), King Fahad Airport (1,7 ξ_2), and Bat'ha (1,0 ξ_2). Those five ports together accounted for V Γ ,9 ξ_2 of the total merchandise imports of the Kingdom.




Methodology

GASTAT's statistics on International trade are built on administrative records from Saudi Customs (non-oil) and the Ministry of Energy (oil). Saudi Arabia's merchandise exports and imports are classified according to the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding Systems (Γ . IV), also known as the Harmonized System (HS), which is maintained by the World Customs Organization (WCO). The HS allows countries to classify traded products in an internationally standardized system of product names and codes. Oil exports refer to exported goods classified in Chapter Γ V (mineral fuels, mineral oils and products of their distillation; bituminous substances; mineral waxes) of the Harmonized System (HS). Non-oil exports refer to all other goods exported (including petrochemicals).
