

Merchandise exports and imports declined by 57.9% and 36.5%, respectively, in May 2020

Merchandise exports decreased by 57.9% in May 2020 compared to May 2019. The value of exports amounted to 36,506 million riyals in May 2020, down from 86,708 million riyals in May 2019. This decrease originated mainly from oil exports, which fell by 44,277 million riyals or 65.0% in the same period. The share of oil exports in total exports, therefore, decreased from 78.6% (May 2019) to 65.4% (May 2020). Compared to the previous month (April 2020), total merchandise exports also decreased by 610 million riyals or 1.6%.

Non-oil exports declined by 31.9% year-on-year in May 2020, falling down to 12,640 million riyals. "Plastics, Rubber and Articles thereof" (32.5% of non-oil merchandise exports) declined by 34.3% (-2,145 million riyals) and "Products of the Chemical or Allied Industries" (29.3% of non-oil merchandise exports) declined by 37.9% (-2,266 million riyals) from May 2019. Non-oil exports also decreased compared to the previous month (April 2020) by 471 million riyals or 3.6%.

Merchandise imports decreased by 36.5% (-19,842 million riyals) in May 2020. The value of imports amounted to 34,534 million riyals in May 2020 compared to 54,376 million riyals in May 2019. This decrease was due to the decrease in many sections compared to May 2019, mainly "Machinery and Mechanical Appliances; Electrical Equipment" (-31.7%) and "Vehicles and Associated Transport Equipment" (-45.8%). Imports also decreased compared to the previous month (April 2020), by 3,551 million riyals or 9.3%.

Ratio of Non-oil Exports to Imports at 36.6%

The ratio of non-oil exports to imports increased to 36.6% in May 2020 compared to 34.1% in May 2019. This is due to a lower decrease in non-oil exports (-31.9%) than the decrease in imports (-36.5%) during this period.

China is Saudi Arabia's main trading partner for merchandise trade

In May 2020, exports to China amounted to 7,705 million riyals, rendering the country the main destination for exports of Saudi Arabia. South Korea and United Arab Emirates followed next with 3,078 million riyals and 3,017 million riyals, respectively. Japan, India, U.S.A, the Netherlands, Singapore, Egypt, and Belgium were the other countries that ranked in the top 10 destinations. Exports of Saudi Arabia to those 10 countries amounted to 26,740 million riyals, accounting for 73.2% of the total exports.

Imports from China amounted to 8,698 million riyals in May 2020, rendering the country the main origin for imports of Saudi Arabia. U.S.A and Germany followed next with imports of 3,616 million riyals and 1,857 million riyals, respectively. United Arab Emirates, Japan, South Korea, India, Italy, Egypt, and United Kingdom were the other countries that ranked in the top 10 countries for imports. Imports of Saudi Arabia from those 10 countries amounted to 22,583 million riyals, accounting for 65.4% of the total imports.

Top Five Customs Ports for Imports

10,478 million riyals of imports, corresponding to 30.3% of the total, entered the Kingdom from Jeddah Islamic Sea Port in May 2020. Among the other major ports of entry for the imports were King Abdul-Aziz Port (22.8%), King Khalid International Airport (14.0%), Riyadh (Dry Port) (6.3%), and King Fahad Airport (5.7%). Those five ports together accounted for 79.0% of the total merchandise imports of the Kingdom.


Methodology

GASTAT's statistics on International trade are built on administrative records from Saudi Customs (non-oil) and the Ministry of Energy (oil). Saudi Arabia's merchandise exports and imports are classified according to the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding Systems (2017), also known as the Harmonized System (HS), which is maintained by the World Customs Organization (WCO). The HS allows countries to classify traded products in an internationally standardized system of product names and codes. Oil exports refer to exported goods classified in Chapter 27 of the Harmonized System (HS) (mineral fuels, mineral oils and products of their distillation; bituminous substances; mineral waxes). Non-oil exports refer to all other goods exported (including petrochemicals).
