Brief

Introduction

In pursuit of economic integration among Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries, the Supreme Council of the Gulf Cooperation Council issued the «GCC Common Market Document» in 2008 to ensure the legal framework for the market launched by Supreme Council decision in 2007. The GCC Common Market aims to achieve the free movement of goods, capital, and labor. This comes within the GCC objectives, which include enhancing integration between member states in various economic, social, and legislative fields.

In pursuit of fulfilling the GCC Common Market requirements monitored by the Financial and Economic Cooperation Committee in light of Supreme Council decisions and the Economic Agreement, the GCC Common Market Committee was tasked with resolving issues and removing obstacles impeding the Common Market's progress, in addition to monitoring the implementation of decisions related to joint work on the ground.

GCC Common Market Areas

The market areas were established based on Gulf Cooperation Council decisions aimed at improving integration in economic and social fields. Statistical offices in each GCC member state provide quantitative data in these areas to highlight efforts in achieving GCC Common Market requirements and identifying gaps, which in turn support decision-makers in taking necessary measures and policies to ensure implementation of decisions aimed at enhancing integration between member states.

Accordingly, the General Authority for Statistics presents its first publication summarizing Saudi Arabia's efforts in working to achieve GCC Common Market requirements, reflecting the Kingdom's continuous pursuit of maximum integration and cooperation between member states

Indicators and Data Sources

This publication is based on administrative records data from national entities in Saudi Arabia, where required data was collected, studied, and compiled to extract the required indicators





01 | **Movement of GCC Citizens**








Second: Government and Private Sector Employment Path



02 | Social Insurance Law Coverage










02 | Number of licenses granted to GCC citizens for economic activities in Saudi Arabia (2017-2023)









